EVENT INFORMATION GUIDE

GENERAL PROCEDURES

I. EVENT MANAGER

An Event Manager is recruited for each event. The Event Manager determines how the event will be run within the guidelines as noted below. *The Event Manager should have an Event Information Guide at the event to resolve any disputes regarding the competition.* In addition, the Event Manager shall refer to the Events Chairman as needed for further assistance.

The Event Manager must prepare a scoring sheet prior to the event to record all scores. The Event Manager then reports all final scores on the EVENT REPORT FORM. EVENT REPORT FORMS will be distributed to Event Chairmen at the July Olympics Committee meeting. When all scores are recorded, the Event Manager:

1. Determines the final standing (ranking) of *EACH* club on the Event Report Form
2. Records the name(s) of the winner(s) at the bottom of the form
3. Gives the completed Event Report Form to the Scoring Manager
4. **Summarizes the event at the Awards Dinner and makes award(s)**

II. SCORING MANAGER

The Scoring Manager assigns the points earned by each club based on the rank they achieved and using the point system that is shown on the following pages. The results of all events are entered in the computer and the final standings are determined. These results, together with the names of all club winners and individual winners, are given to the Olympics Chair for presentation of awards at the banquet.

III. TIES

Each club in a tie will get the tie and place points. Points for the next best club will skip to one below. For example, in a tie for first place, both clubs get first-place points and the next best club gets third-place points. **The Event Manager must decide which winning team will receive the award.** For Grand Totals: ties will be broken by "Best Finishes" method, i.e. the team with the most first places, second places, etc.

IV. AWARD PATCHES

Patches suitable to affix to your club banner, or otherwise, will be awarded to the clubs receiving the top three points. These patches are intended to be kept permanently by the clubs receiving them.

V. MOST-IMPROVED-CLUB AWARD PATCH

This patch is awarded to the club with the highest percent increase in total points over the previous year. Clubs not participating in at least one event in both the current year and the previous year are not eligible.

VI. HIGH EFFICIENCY AWARD PATCH

This patch is awarded to the club that averages the most points per member. Example: A club has 35 members. They score a total of 700 points in the Olympics. Divide 35 into 700 to get an average points per member of 20. This shows the club is getting a good production per member. Its an award that encourages the small clubs as we no longer have small and large club awards.

EVENTS and SCORING

BACKGAMMON - NOT OFFERED IN 2011

BADMINTON--SINGLES AND DOUBLES (Determined by event registration numbers)

Scoring:	30 Point First Place (Singles); 60 Point First Place (Doubles)
Team Size:	Singles/Doubles
Maximum Teams:	No Limit
Location:	Courts, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

RULES:

1. Scoring-15 points - 2 out of 3 games for match - serve to score
2. Self-refereeing. The Olympics badminton will be either a double elimination or round-robin format, depending on the number of teams that sign up for the event.

The Game

Hit the shuttlecock so that it lands on your opponent's side of the court within the boundaries after your serve. This gives you a point. You also get points when your opponent hits the shuttlecock out of bounds, or breaks a rule, *if it was your serve*. If you rack up 21 points, you win the game. Three games make a match. The winner is the best of three matches.

A rally is begun when a player serves the ball from the service court.

The first serve must land within the opposite service box, after that the play is within the entire service area. Execute a serve by holding the shuttle in your fingertips, arm extended straight in front of you, then hit the shuttle with an underhand racket swing that begins from behind your back parallel to the ground. When the score is even, serve from the right service court and from the left when the score is odd. When the server fails to score, it is the opponent's turn to serve.

Once the rally is begun, you can hit the shuttlecock with overhand, underhand, and sidearm strokes, as well as blocking strokes, hairpin drop shots, and smashes.

1. If the game is tied 20-all, continue playing until one side has a two point lead, up to 30 points.
2. Switch sides after each game.
3. Each side only gets one strike to get the shuttlecock over the net.
4. Only the server can gain points.
5. A "let" is allowed for external disturbances to the game, and the serve is replayed.
6. The shuttle is allowed to touch the net during play without fault or stopping the rally, if it continues over. During a serve, if the shuttle hits the net then falls in the proper service court, it is a let.
7. Players cannot reach over the net with their racket to hit the birdie.
8. The shuttle must make one contact with the racket – it cannot be carried, or allowed to come to rest on the head before being thrown.

BASKETBALL (Skills)

Scoring:	30 Point First Place
Participants:	Individual
Maximum	
Participants:	No Limit - Only one club member's score will count
Location:	Courts, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

RULES: Rules are not official at this time. Rules may change.

3-point Shot

Participants will be allowed six attempts to shoot from around the 3-point arc. Each **basket made** will be worth 10 points. The last ball will be worth 20 points. There will be a 30-second time limit. Maximum points awarded would be 70.

Passing

Participants will take six attempts, three bounce and three chest or overhead, at a designated target from assigned distance. You will receive **10 points if the ball goes in the hole and 5 points if the ball only hits the board**. The passes will be made from 3 different locations. Final pass will be worth double points. Maximum points awarded would be 70 points.

Free-Throw Shooting

Participants will be allowed 5 free-throw attempts from the free-throw line. Each point will be worth 10 points. The last ball will be worth 20 points. There will be a 45-second time limit. Maximum points awarded would be 60 points.

Total Points possible for the event will be 200.

BATTLESHIP

Scoring:	30 Point First Place
Team Size:	1 Club Member (<i>Bring your own board</i>)
Maximum Teams:	No Limit
Location:	Near Concession Area, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

RULES:

1. Round robin competition; one point for each win.
2. Club placing and points based on total score of best individual in each club.
3. In case of a tie, head-to-head competition determines winner.
4. Event Manager is final arbiter of rules and winner.
5. *There will be a one-minute-per-move limitation.*

BICYCLE RACE

Scoring: 30 Point First Place (See Appendix A at the end of this Guide)
Race Distance: 12.3 miles **OR** 7.3 miles
Location: Middleton - Park at Keva Sports Center
Bike Race Route: Start & Finish at Airport Road and Deming Way (.15 miles from Keva)
West on Airport Road; (1) Right on Bronner;
(2) Left on Koch;
(3) Right on Vosen;
(4) Right on Schneider;
(5) Right on Capitol View;
(6) Right on Airport to complete a 2nd loop (or left on Airport if riding one loop); then
(7) Left on Airport and finish at Deming Way (see map)

MAP AVAILABLE AT RACE

COST: **\$10/person to cover insurance policy rider**
Events: Two Individual Events (Men's and Women's Divisions)
Maximum Number: No Limit

RULES:

1. Safety first. Any actions deemed unsafe by the Event Manger will result in disqualification.
2. This is a time trial; each rider against the clock. No drafting behind other cyclists or vehicles. This is for safety and for fairness. Drafting is defined as:
 - a. being a static distance within 3 bike lengths of another cyclist/vehicle for more than 10 seconds;
 - b. riding next to another cyclist/vehicle for more than 10 seconds.
3. Participants may complete 2 loops (12.3 miles) or 1 loop (7.3 miles). Scoring: all participants completing 2 loops (in ascending time order); THEN participants completing 1 loop (in ascending time order).
4. Making the left turn from Capitol View Road onto Airport Road is potentially dangerous. A Town of Middleton police officer plans to be stopping traffic both ways on Airport Road to aid you. **HOWEVER**, an emergency could pull them from our race. **WHEN YOU APPROACH AIRPORT ROAD TO MAKE YOUR LEFT TURN, IF THE SHERIFF IS NOT THERE, YOU ARE REQUIRED TO COME TO A FULL STOP, ENSURE IT IS SAFE TO MAKE A LEFT TURN, AND THEN PROCEED.** In the event the Sheriff needs to leave partway through the race, 20 seconds will be added to the times of all riders that didn't need to stop (because the Sheriff was there) as a way to even out times.
5. Participants are required to ride in a safe manner and are responsible for having their bicycles in proper operating condition.
6. Helmets must be worn and chin straps must be fastened while racing.
7. Roads that the course is on will be open to traffic. Stay to the right and obey traffic signs as you normally would. You are responsible for your safety.
8. If you need to pass another cyclist:
 - a. make sure the road is clear of traffic;
 - b. pass on the left of the cyclist in front of you;
 - c. announce "on your left" as you approach them so they know you are there.
9. Fastest biker from each club scores points for that club.
10. ***Have fun – it's not every day that you get to do a bike race!***

- Racers will get a number when they register; place on the RIGHT side of youe helmet.
 - Racers will leave every 30 seconds in the order in which they registered; line up so 8 to 10 racers are in order and ready to go.

BILLIARDS (9 BALL)

Scoring:	60 Point First Place; house sets up and scores; Event Chair needs to work out particulars to rank teams, etc.
COST:	\$10 per person
Team Size:	One 2-person team per club; more based on availability
Maximum Teams:	Up to 60 players (12-15 tables)
Location:	Brass Ring, 701 E. Washington Ave. (256-9359)

RULES:

1. One foot must be on the floor at all times
2. The break is determined by a flip of a coin
3. Scottish Doubles - alternate shots for team members
4. On a scratch, the cue ball can be placed anywhere on the table (ball in hand).
5. Cue ball must hit object ball first. Failure to do so results in ball in hand for the other team.
6. All balls remain in the pockets, even if a foul occurs
7. If the cue ball goes in a pocket trying to get the 9-ball in, the other team gets ball in hand.
8. No smoking by participants in the playing area.
9. All matches will be determined by the best two out of three games. If time allows, if a team loses the first two games to start a match, they may opt to play the third game for fun and practice. Remember, this is about having fun!
10. We will play a round-robin tournament. The teams will be ranked by total wins. There will be no playoff unless there is a tie for first place, in which case a three-game series will determine the champion.

BOCCE (Updated 2010)

Scoring:	60 Point First Place (depending on number of players)
COST:	No Charge
Team Size:	1 to 4 Club Members
Maximum Teams:	Each Club may enter 2 teams, with scoring counting only for the highest-scoring team
Location:	Fields, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

SCORING RULES:

1. *Bocce is fun, so please have fun!*
2. Please be respectful of all players at all times.
3. Six 12-minute Round-Robin games or Five 15-minute games, based upon number of teams participating.
4. Play to start and stop on Event Manager's whistle.
5. The two players not in play will serve as the officials.
6. Rank to be determined by win/loss/tie record, then overall points. (Win is 2 points, Loss is -1 point, Tie is 0 points. Overall points are a tally of all points scored in the Round-Robin series of games.)
7. Top Four teams (of different clubs, SCO regulation) enter finals round.
8. Semi-finals and finals games played to 15, win by 2.
9. Losers of semis play for 3rd and 4th.
10. Please record your game results, W/L/T and game scores.
11. Please attend the dinner to receive your award if victorious, or even if you are not!
12. Event Manager, John Bonsett-Veal will settle all disputes.

14. *Bocce is fun, so please have fun!*

BOCCE - CONTINUED

RULES OF PLAY:

1. Do not begin until the whistle, and stop on the whistle. Tally and record the scores with Event Manager.
2. Flip coin to see who throws the Pallino and the first ball.
3. Opposite team throws second ball.
4. All of the next balls are then thrown by whichever team is not closest to the Pallino, unless one team is out, and then the other team throws all their remaining balls.
5. If a ball goes out of bounds, it is out of play.
6. The Pallino must go at least one-half the length of the field and stay inbounds. If an invalid throw occurs, the throw moves to the opposite team.
7. If the Pallino is knocked out of bounds during play, the frame is over, no score awarded, play moves to the opposite end.
8. Only one team may score in a frame. The score is the total of all their balls that are closer than the closest ball of their opponent.
9. Stop all play at the second whistle and immediately score the frame, even if it is a partial frame.
10. Please request assistance from the Event Manager, John Bonsett-Veal, for any questions or disputes.

TEAM BOWLING

Scoring:	120 Points First Place
COST:	\$7 per person, including shoes
Team Size:	4 Club Members
Maximum Teams:	Each Club may enter 2 teams, with scoring counting only for the highest-scoring team
Location:	Schwoegler's Park Town Lanes; 440 Grand Canyon Drive 833-7272

RULES:

1. Each of the bowlers will bowl three (3) games and add the score to come up with their series.
2. The team score will be the total of the four (4) team members' series.
3. The team score will then be ranked and points awarded to each team in accordance with a 120-point event.
4. Clubs unable to field a four-person team can combine with another club and receive partial points on a pro-rata basis.
5. It is recommended for clubs entering two teams to put their four (4) best players on the same team since it will not be possible to combine series for bowlers on different teams.
6. In the event of no-shows, and a team has less than four (4) bowlers, a "blind score" of 120 points per game, or 360 points for the series, will be assigned. The appropriate "No Show" penalty, as shown on the Point System Guide, will be applied to the total team score.
7. We pay cash for strikes occurring with colored head pin showing. This has no effect on scoring for the Olympics.

BRIDGE

Scoring: 60 Point First Place
Team Size: 2 Club Members
Maximum Teams: No Limit
Location: Area near restrooms, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

RULES:

1. Round robin competition
2. Club placing and points based on total score of best team in each club
3. Five games with a time limit will be played. The Event Manager will make a decision regarding an additional game based on available time.

Team Size: 2 Club Members (*Bring your own board*)
Maximum Teams: No Limit
Location: Area near restrooms, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

1. Round robin competition
2. Club placing and points based on total score of best team in each club

Scoring: 60 Point First Place
Team Size: 2 Club Members
Maximum Teams: No Limit
Location: Area near restrooms, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

RULES:

1. Round robin competition
2. Club placing and points based on total score of best team in each club

GOLF

Scoring:	120 Point First Place (Team Event); 30 Point First Place (Individual Event)
COST:	\$45 per Person (greens fees, carts, prizes)
Team Size:	4 golfers
Maximum Teams:	32 teams maximum; NO PM GOLF!
Location:	Bridges Golf Course, 2702 Shopko Drive, Highway 30

This will be a Scramble event

Registration

1. Golf registration forms shall be submitted with all other event registration. **Registration forms will not be accepted after the deadline.** Include **FIRST AND LAST** name and **FULL CLUB NAME** on registration form. If a name can be construed to be either male or female, please indicate gender.
2. The Bridges rules require all participants to use golf carts. Registrations without-of-bounds fees will not be accepted.

Scramble Rules

1. A scramble means that all four team members tee off on each hole and then decide which tee shot they like the best and mark the spot with a tee or ball marker.
2. The other team members pick up their balls and place them within one club length (no closer to the hole) of the marked spot. Each team member hits their next shot from the chosen spot of the prior shot.
3. This procedure is followed on every shot for the remainder of the hole, including putts. The ball should be marked on the putting green also.
4. Putts need to be made at the marked spot on the green. The first ball to go in the hole is counted for the team score.
5. If the ball you choose to play is in a hazard (sand, water, etc.), the rough, or out-of-bounds of bounds, you cannot drop the ball out-of-bounds side of the hazard or rough even if relief is within one club length away.
6. Each team must use at least two of each team member's tee shots on each nine (minimum two tee shots per player).
7. Men tee off from the white tees and women, from the red tees.

HORSESHOES

Scoring:	60 Point First Place

RULES:

1. Elimination placing
2. Played and scored as doubles

PING PONG

Scoring: 60 Point First Place
COST: No Charge
Team Size: 2 Club Members (***Bring your own paddle***)
Maximum Teams: One per club; more based on availability
Location: Fields, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

RULES:

1. Round-robin competition
2. Played and scored as doubles
3. Players alternate shots

5K RUN

Scoring: 30 Point First Place for runners
Team Size: 2 Individual Events (Men's and Women's Divisions)
Maximum Number: No Limit
Location: Start at Keva Sports Center Parking Lot (map is posted at event)

RULES:

1. Fastest runner from each club scores points for that club
2. Include ***FIRST AND LAST*** name on registration form. If a name can be construed to be either male or female, please indicate gender.

5K WALK

Scoring: Walkers for a club receive 15 points total (regardless of number of walkers participating for a club)
Team Size: Individual Event
Maximum Number: No Limit
Location: Start at Keva Sports Center Parking Lot (map is posted at event)

SCRABBLE

Scoring: 30 Point First Place
Team Size: 1 Club Member (***Bring your own game***)
Maximum Teams: No Limit
Location: Near Concession Area, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

RULES:

1. Round-robin competition
2. Club placing and points based on total score of best individual in each club
3. *There will be a one-minute-per-move limitation*

SWIMMING

Scoring:	120 Point First Place
COST:	\$5 per club per team
Team Size:	4 Club Members (<i>mandatory</i>)
Maximum Teams:	One per club; more based on availability
Location:	Middleton/Cross Plains Area Indoor Pool (Middleton High School) 2230 Bristol Street, Middleton (829-9863)

EVENT MANAGER RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Contact Lucas Francois at Middleton Cross Plains School District at 829-9863 approximately four months ahead of time and, subsequently, two (2) weeks ahead and, finally, one (1) day ahead, to arrange:
 - a. No pool conflicts during Olympics scheduled times
 - b. Lane markers
 - c. Automatic starter
2. We supply:
 - a. Stopwatches (2)
 - b. Starter
 - c. Timers
3. On the scheduled day of the event, arrive a minimum of 60 minutes before event and double check all arrangements.

RULES:

1. 100-yard free relay against time. Team with lowest time gets first place.
2. Lifeguards on hand
3. Starter's decision is final
4. Start:
 - a. "Swimmers, this is a 100-yard free relay"
 - b. "Swimmers, take your mark"
 - c. "Go" on automatic starting system (provided by MCPA)
 - d. False start announcement by whistle or pistol
 - e. One false start allowed per team
5. Swimmer cannot touch bottom once leg of relay is started until swimmer touches end of pool.
6. Relay start (for second and subsequent swimmers), previous swimmer must touch end of pool with **any** part of body **before** next swimmer's **feet** leave the starting block or wall. NO running starts.
7. Stop: Timed when last swimmer touches end of pool with **any** part of the body.
8. Re-running of teams not allowable.

TENNIS

Scoring:	60 Point First Place
COST:	\$20 per Person
Team Size:	2 Club Members
Maximum Teams:	One team guaranteed per club; more based on availability
Location:	John Powless Tennis Center, 801 Struck Street (274-6262)

RULES:

1. Doubles Tennis
2. Format determined once the number of teams is known
3. No-ad Scoring
4. Only one team per club may earn points

TEXAS HOLD 'EM (Updated 8/2009)

Scoring: 30 Point First Place
Team Size: Individual Event
Maximum Number: 50
Location: Brass Ring, 701 E. Washington Ave. (256-9359)

TEXAS HOLD 'EM EVENT MANAGER RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Contact venue by **May 5** to reserve the VIP room and the necessary tables.
2. Confirm all arrangements one month prior to the event and again 2 days prior.
3. Also, 2 weeks before the event, give venue an estimate of the number of participants so they can schedule wait staff **for the room** if participant numbers warrant.
4. On the night of the event, arrive at 5:00 p.m. to confirm final arrangements and equipment, put seat numbers and table numbers on the tables and count out stacks of chips. Give each player \$2,550 in chips as noted in the rules: 5 each of white and red, 4 green and 2 blue. No re-buys are allowed and giving chips to other players is forbidden.
5. Print extra copies of the rules and the blinds and chip values pages - one for each table.
6. Announce before the start of the event that everyone must check in with you before they leave if they are to get participation points for their clubs and that ALL participants score just for competing.
7. Assign participants to tables by using cards ace through 8 from a few decks and having participants draw cards for their table, then same for their seat position, based upon the number of participants (or another random seat assignment method).
8. Bring a pen and score sheet to record the names of contestants and the order in which they finish. The original participant list you receive from the Olympics Events Chair will list each participant and his or her respective club. You will also receive an official Event Report Form on which to summarize the results of all participants.

RULES:

Chip values: White Chip is \$50, Red is \$100, Green is \$200, Blue is \$500 and Black is \$1,000. Each player starts with \$2,550 in chips as follows: 5 White chips, 5 Red, 4 Green and 2 Blue.

Small Blind is player left of dealer; Big Blind is player left of the Small Blind. Small and Big Blinds post bets according to the tournament summary sheet before each hand is dealt, with Big Blind always equal to the minimum bet and minimum raise and Small Blind about one-half of Big Blind. See the printed tournament summary sheet to be posted on each table for exact starting Blind amounts. The Blinds will be increased regularly as determined by tournament director.

Deal rotates clockwise beginning with the player to dealer's left. Each player picks a card from a fanned deck to determine first deal of the night (high card). Player to right of dealer cuts the deck. Actual cut is mandatory.

Each player is dealt his or her first pocket card in turn, then his/her second.

Player to Big Blind's left bets first. He/She can call by matching the Big Blind and may also raise the bet by adding in any amount of chips equal to or greater than the Big Blind. In this round, checking is not permitted. If player does not want to bid or call, player must fold.

Once the first betting round completes, dealer burns one card then lays out the first three community cards in the center of the table. This is called the flop.

This betting round begins with the first remaining seat on dealer's left. Checking is permitted now and for the rest of the hand. Bets are placed (no limit), but must be at least the amount of the original Big Blind.

Dealer burns the top card before a fourth community card is dealt onto the table. This betting round begins with the first remaining seat on the dealer's left (no limit).

Dealer will burn one more card before the fifth and final community card is dealt. Bets and Raises continue (no limit).

There is no betting limit.

If, at anytime, a player is forced from betting because they cannot match a raise, a second pot will be started to accommodate the subsequent bets. If player who was unable to continue betting wins the hand, they will claim the primary pot and the secondary pot goes to the best hand among the remaining players who contributed into it.

The best 5 card hand wins:

Royal Flush: A-K-Q-J-10, all same suit

Straight Flush: any five consecutive cards, all same suit

Four-of-a-Kind: four cards, same value (eg. four 7's)

Full House: Three-of-a-Kind and a Pair

Flush: any five cards of the same suit

Straight: any five consecutive cards

Three-of-a-Kind: three cards, same value

Two Pair

Pair

No Pair: five dissimilar cards, mixed suit (Ace high)

Players may form their final hands from any combination of the community cards and their own pocket cards, even ignoring the pocket cards and using only the table cards if they wish.

No cheating. Any player found to be cheating will be dismissed and their chips will be divided between the remaining players at his or her table.

Remember: This is a fun game and includes players of all levels. WE ARE NOT FOLLOWING STRICT TOURNAMENT RULES. If you have any questions, please ask.

VOLLEYBALL

Scoring:	180 Point First Place
COST:	No Charge
Team Size:	4 minimum to start a game; 6 maximum on court
Maximum Teams:	One per club; more based on availability
Location:	Courts, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

RULES:

1. Club members may form a team with other club members
2. Points earned by multi-club teams will be apportioned on a pro-rata share
3. Double elimination tournament
4. Each match consists of one 15-point game

BAIT CASTING

Scoring:	30 Point First Place
Team Size:	Individual Event
Maximum Number:	No Limit
Location:	Inside on Fields, Keva Sports Center, Middleton

RULES:

2. Enter the totals on the Event Report Form.

Each “trivia time” will consist of 15 trivia questions worth one point for each correctly answered question. The trivia questions will have a Wisconsin theme in the categories of History, Sports, Geography and Politics.

RULES:

√ Club representatives may come to the Trivia table and pick up the trivia questions for that round any time in the 30-minute period.

√ At the end of the “trivia period,” answers must be turned in so Club representatives will want to get there at the start of the period in order to give themselves the full amount of time to answer the questions.

√ Clubs may have 1 to 3 representatives answering questions in any round; they don’t have to be the same people for each round.

√ Representatives will answer the questions in the “trivia area” where there will be no cell phones or any other electronic devices allowed.

√ Once they complete the questions for that period they turn them in at the trivia area to the person managing the event.

√ Standings will be determined based on total number of correctly answered questions, i.e., 45 correctly answered questions = 45 points.

WIFFLEGOLF CHIPPING

Scoring:	30 Point First Place

CLOSEST TO THE PIN:

Objective:

To hit the wiffle golf ball within the circular bulls eye to accumulate the highest point total in one round.

Rules:

Each player will have 5 wiffle golf balls to hit from the designated area towards the golf flag. Points will be awarded for balls hit “closest to the pin.” After each player completes their 5 balls and points are tallied, player will clear the balls for the next player.

Scoring:

There will be 4 rings, each with an increasing point value, in which the ball must be hit. The 20-foot circle constitutes 5 points; the 15-foot circle constitutes 10 points; 10-foot circle is 15 points, and 5-foot circle is 20 points. Points will be awarded for the position of the ball after it stops moving and total points of all 5 balls will be tallied for the final score.

DINNER AND AWARDS

Scoring:

Club points are determined by percent of club members attending

Formula:

$$\frac{\text{Tickets Purchased by Club}}{\text{Number of Members in Club}} \times 60 = \text{Points}$$

MANAGEMENT

Scoring:

30 points for each club that manages or co-manages an event or serves in a lead position (e.g., Event Manager, Olympian, Treasurer, etc.). **Based on the need for event managers, it was decided at the June 6, 2011, Olympics Committee meeting to award points for every event managed by a club rather than limiting points to two managed events.**

MEETINGS

Scoring:

Attendance is very important to the smooth operation of the Olympics. Points are awarded the clubs with representatives in attendance at the planning and wrap-up meetings. Twenty-five points per meeting per club may be earned via attendance. Clubs that have a representative at ALL the Olympics planning meetings earn an additional 50 points.

OLYMPIAN OF THE YEAR

Scoring:

25 points for each club that nominates a candidate for "Olympian of the Year." A club that submits an update for a candidate they formerly submitted will receive 25 points. No points are earned for candidates that were formerly submitted, but for whom no updates are submitted.

LIABILITY

It is understood and agreed that all participants are competing at their own risk and the Madison Area Service Clubs and the Olympics Committee shall be held harmless from any claims arising from these Olympic activities.
